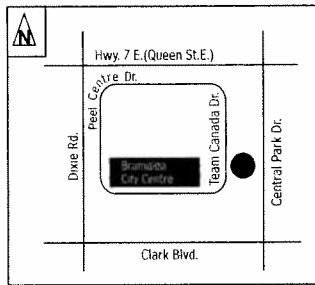
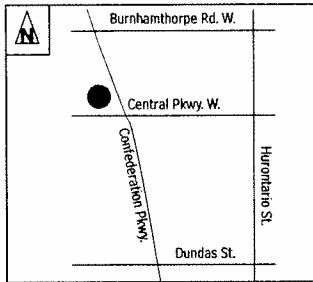

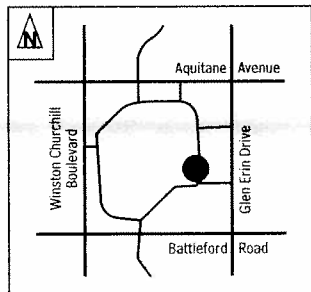

Do you have children who are new to Canada?  
Do you need an immunization record for your child?  
Are you signing up for a daycare or school in Peel?

Peel Public Health's **Routine Immunization Clinics** will give your children the immunizations needed to go to daycare or school (kindergarten to grade 12) in Peel Region if they:

- Are at least one year old
- Do not have an Ontario Health Card
- Do not have an immunization record

## Where are the clinics?

Clinics are in Brampton and Mississauga and held by appointment only.



## How do I book an appointment?

Call 905-799-7700 for an appointment. There are no evening or weekend clinics.

The nurse will ask you for your child's:

- Name
- Age
- Gender (boy or girl)
- Phone number

## When should I call?

Call Peel Public Health at least two weeks **before** signing your child up for daycare or school.

## Why does my child need immunizations?

In Ontario, laws require that every child under the age of 18 who is going to daycare or school have specific immunizations. Your child cannot go to daycare or school without them.

## Parent checklist:

To do:

- Come to your appointment on time. If you are unable to come or are late for your appointment, please call the nurse at 905-799-7700.
- Bring documents that show your child's name and date of birth, such as a passport or a permanent residency card.
- Bring someone with you who can read and understand English.

Make sure your child:

- Knows he/she will be getting two needles
- Eats a good lunch or breakfast before coming
- Wears a shirt that has short sleeves



Once the needles are given, the nurse will give you a yellow card and the documents you need in order to sign your child up for daycare or school. Your child will need more immunizations in two months. You can go to a walk-in clinic or your family doctor when you get your Ontario Health Card.

After your child gets the needles, you will need to wait in the clinic for 15 minutes.
